FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . .

May is often a momentous month.

The winding down of the school year, Mother's Day, college graduations, Memorial Day—all these are important annual occurrences and celebrations that take place in May.

May seems to bring a lot of activities and opportunities in the life of our church as well. You can find more details about many of these events in other sections of this edition of the *Announcer*.

It all begins with our JHBC Bible Drill team participating in the state-level Bible Drill at Village Baptist Church in Fayetteville on May 1 (youth) and May 2 (children).

It continues with Senior Saints' Sunday on May 3 in our 11:00 A.M. Worship Service. I'll be preaching for Senior Saints' Sunday this year as we celebrate and express our appreciation for the significant contributions to the life and leadership of our church our older members have made through the years and continue to make. Our senior saints will help lead our worship.

Saturday, May 9, we'll go to Kiwanis Park again for our JHBC Day in the Park from 1:00 to 5:00 P.M. This is always a great time of fellowship and a wonderful way to connect with the community beyond the walls of our church buildings.

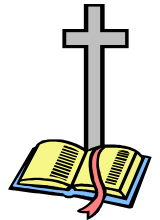
On Mother's Day, we'll celebrate God's good gift of family and family of faith. This family focus will continue as the youth group goes to a concert in Fayetteville on Saturday, May 16, and our children help lead us in worship on Children's Sunday, May 17, in the 11:00 A.M. service. This service will include recognition of our Bible Drill team.

Our G.A. Recognition Service will take place on Sunday evening, May 17 in the 7:00 P.M. service.

Our high school seniors will take their senior trip Friday through Sunday, May 22-24, as they get away together to celebrate their upcoming graduations in June.

Beginning the first Sunday evening in May during the Discipleship Training time (5:30 – 6:45 P.M. for this study), Heather Webb and other students from the Campbell University Divinity School will lead a study on the major world religions. This study should be very helpful to us in understanding those of other faiths—many of whom now live among us in Sanford—so we can be more effective in sharing the gospel with them in winsome ways.

The last Sunday of the month, May 31, will be Pentecost Sunday, when we remember how on that first Pentecost following Jesus' resurrection, God poured out His Spirit on the church. It's fitting, isn't it, that this is how we'll conclude the month? Our annual children's musical, which they are diligently preparing, will be presented on Pentecost evening in the 7:00 P.M. service.

See what I mean? May abounds with opportunities in our church, some of them very momentous!

May will be momentous for me in another way. From May 15-23, I will be in Belize (in Central America) to teach the book of Romans to a group of native Baptist pastors for a week. The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina partners with the Baptist Bible School of Belize to provide training for pastors there. The pastors who are enrolled come to the Baptist camp three weeks a year (one in January, one in May, and one in August) to take three intensive classes each session. After the session, they return to their homes and engage in follow-up study using workbooks designed for pastoral education on the mission field. When they come back for the next session, they are tested on the previous classes and their follow-up work before they start their new classes. Pastors who successfully complete the full cycle of 21 courses earn a Certificate in Pastoral Ministry from the Cape Town Baptist Seminary in South Africa through its external studies program. I am grateful to God for this opportunity to be a part of these pastors' preparation and equipping for their ministries. Please pray for me as I prepare, while I am there, and for my family while I am away. I will be returning the day before we celebrate Jeffrey and Jonathan's 18th birthdays—a momentous occasion for our family!

Family Ministry

If you were unable to attend church Sunday, April 26th, you missed something wonderful. It was a day of massive importance in the life of Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church. You didn't miss a guest speaker or special program. It was something much bigger than either of those. It was a day when Family Ministry was lived out in our church.

Many have misunderstood Family Ministry to mean a "downsizing" of youth and children's ministry into one new ministry. It is so very much more than that. Family ministry is concerned with the way our church functions as a family. It's just that simple.

So, what was so special about that Sunday? It was a day not very different from a Sunday the early church might have celebrated. Two children, a youth, and an adult were baptized that day, having completed a time of preparation and instruction. Baptism is part of our worship service because it is, indeed, a worshipful act. Four people were "initiated" into the family of our church. Four people chose to leave behind their former lives and be buried with and raised in Christ. Could there be a better reason for celebration? They are now our brothers and sisters. The blood of Christ flows through our veins. We are truly family. Later in the worship service, we celebrated communion with Christ as a new and expanded family. I absolutely believe that there was celebration in heaven. Maybe we should be a bit more vocal in our celebration on earth!

It's extremely significant that we gathered together after the worship service for a common meal. In doing that, we were still worshiping God. We were marking that important day by sitting at the table together. We laughed and told stories, exchanged recipes, and enjoyed each other. That's what a family should be like. But, we know that families don't always function that well.

Many people come to the church looking for a family they never had. Families are being torn to shreds in our culture. Even when families are intact, there is often little healthy interchange going on within the walls of our homes. When that is the case, it's only natural to go out and search for something that meets that need. In our culture, that often means going from relationship to relationship, desperately seeking acceptance and belonging.

Sometimes, unfortunately, churches don't give high priority to functioning as a family. People come and visit only to find backbiting, gossip, and turmoil. Visitors are looking for many things in a church, but none of those. That's why we have to be intentional about being family. Paul tells us that when one of us rejoices, we all stop and rejoice with him/her. When one of us mourns, we mourn together. When one of us faces hardship, we face it together. We don't watch baptism in a detached manner. We are literally watching our brother or sister being baptized and we celebrate that. Neither do we watch the suffering of another indifferently. That is what attracted people to the church as described in Acts. It was something so different from the dominant culture that people flocked to the church. We have to be that different! Otherwise, people do just as well to join social clubs.

Let's never be so busy "playing church" that we forget who we are. We are the family of Christ. That's an awesome responsibility. We can't afford to be so busy filling an hour's worth of worship that we don't stop to celebrate and mourn transition times in our people's lives. Every time we do that, we tell our Story to the world.

I've been involved in research on Family ministry most of this last semester for a project I'm taking part in. I was struck by this quote from *Transforming Rituals: Daily Practices for Changing Lives*:

If you cannot devote a significant portion of one corporate worship to each new convert to Christian faith, your congregation has misplaced priorities. If you cannot devote a significant portion of one corporate worship to each person departing from membership in your church, your congregation is thinking too small. If you cannot devote a significant portion of one corporate worship to persons in your church family who are experiencing rites of passage, your congregation is missing the point. If you cannot devote a significant portion of corporate worship to include an opportunity to hear the reading of letters from scattered pilgrims, both historical and contemporary, you are ignoring an apostolic pattern.

Let's never get to the point where we think we are worshiping only when we are singing or hearing a sermon. Worship is much more complex and vital than that. God has planted each and every one of us in this particular garden called Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church. We have to be intentional about loving each other, taking care of and protecting one another, and always putting the needs of others above our own. Isn't that what a family is supposed to do?

Let's never get to the point where we think we are worshiping only when we are singing or hearing a sermon. Worship is much more complex and vital than that. God has planted each and every one of us in this particular garden called Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church. We have to be intentional about loving each other, taking care of and protecting one another, and always putting the needs of others above our own. Isn't that what a family is supposed to do?

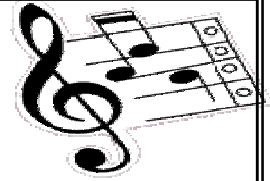

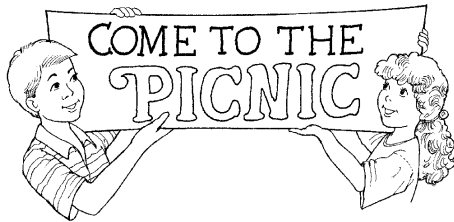
