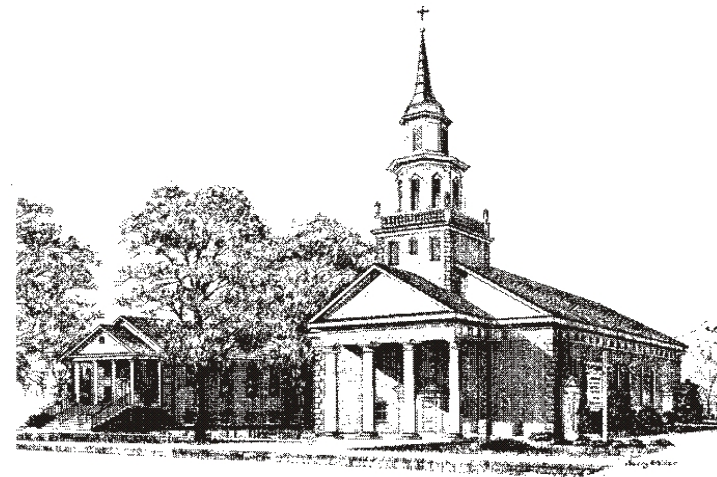

Becoming a Follower of Christ

Being a Christian involves a personal commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Every one of us is a sinner and in need of God's forgiveness. Only Christ can save us and set us right with God through His own life, death on the cross, and resurrection from the dead. Those who put their faith in Him and commit their lives to Him as their Lord experience His forgiveness and are set right with God. Those who have not put their faith in Him are separated from God by their sin, a separation that continues in eternity in hell if they die without Christ.

Trusting Jesus involves recognizing your need of Him, asking Him to forgive you, and committing yourself to Him as your Lord. The Christian life is about following Jesus, getting to know Him, and becoming like Him. Once you trust Christ, being baptized expresses your commitment publicly. Becoming a part of a local congregation helps you to know and serve Christ as a part of His people, the family of God.

Moments in History Trivia – Answers in next week's bulletin

On September 26, 1992, one year prior to the 125th Anniversary of JHBC, the cornerstone of the third house of worship (present Chapel), was opened. Do you know any of the items that were found in that cornerstone?

A Cornerstone Service was held on July 27, 1975 and there were 25 items placed in the cornerstone of this present sanctuary. Do you recall any of the items and the organizations who provided them?

Answers to Last Week's Trivia Questions

What was the first name given to the street Woodland Avenue, which runs beside our church? Woodland Avenue was first named "Baptist Street" and is the only street in Sanford to have been named for a denomination.

What was the cost of the first and only church bus and what color was it? At the April 1971 church conference, the church voted to purchase a used 1965 Dodge bus at a cost of \$4,200. On Monday, June 14, 1971, James Williams, Edna Thomas and Ronnie Rouse went to Cherokee Boys Club to pick up the bus. It was green and white with gold lettering. The bus was donated to the Lee County Parks and Recreation Commission in 1983.
